Re: **URGENT** - Racing Radios Frequency Declaration Form

All teams are required to have FCC licenses and Industry Canada licenses (most teams will have a temporary one for 3R and Mosport) if they are racing with us in Canada. A license does not grant exclusive use of a frequency, it merely grants the right to use a transmitter on a set of frequencies.

Evidently we had two teams at the Sebring test using the same (or very close) frequencies for crew to driver radio communication. IMSA does require all teams to register all frequencies used with Racing Radios. Racing Radios (Chris Yellina) uses this data base to make sure none of the teams will interfere with IMSA communications and also will alert teams if it appears they are both using the same frequencies. This process is called frequency coordination. The frequency coordination is more critical in Canada as some of the US licensed frequencies are used by public safety in Canada.

If anyone has an issue with trying to use the same frequencies as another team, Racing Radios will be at Sebring on the Sunday prior to the race. They are aware we are on track at 8:00 am Monday and will be available to any team needing assistance in frequency coordination.

Every team must register their frequencies with Racing Radios via the frequency declaration sheet attached and fax or email them back **no later than March 1st** to Chris Yellina with Racing Radios.
